Program organized in Gram Sabha	<p><b>Unnat Bharat Abhiyan Commemorates Labour Day with Jagti Sanitation Drive:</b></p> <p>May 1, 2025 – The Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) marked Labour Day in its adopted village, Jagti, by conducting a significant cleanliness and sanitation drive at a prominent sacred site. This initiative, spearheaded by Unnat Bharat Abhiyan RCI IIT Jammu under the guidance of Director Prof. Manoj Singh Gaur, Regional Coordinator</p>

	<p>Prof. Abhay Sharma, and PI Coordinator, Dr. Nalin Sharma, underscored the community's dedication to both recognizing labour and fostering a healthy environment.</p> <p>A central activity involved the concerted effort of village women, who gathered at the sacred site to thoroughly clean the area and install bib cocks on open water pipes. This action significantly enhanced hygiene standards and improved access to clean water for all residents. Additional activities included replacing a leaking 500-litre water tank with a 1000-litre overhead tank and repairing the water outlet of the on-site washroom. (The installation of the water tank, bib cocks, and outlet pipe will be done by the plumber in the evening.) This location holds significant religious importance for the village, revered as the 'Devtas' place. Furthermore, the village women collectively decided to establish a committee and implement a modest monthly contribution system to ensure the ongoing cleanliness, maintenance, and usability of the site.</p>
