Report on TB Elimination Campaign in Adopted Villages

Event Title: "Together Against TB: A Village-wide Mission"

Date: January 26, 2025

The Government of India has implemented several initiatives to combat tuberculosis (TB) in rural areas, focusing on awareness, early detection, and treatment.

Gautam College of Pharmacy (GCOP) in Hamirpur, Himachal Pradesh, actively engages in community outreach programs, including health and hygiene awareness initiatives in adopted villages. These activities are organized through student clubs and the National Service Scheme (NSS).

Tuberculosis (TB) remains a significant public health challenge in India, necessitating comprehensive strategies to eliminate the disease. A pivotal approach involves community engagement, particularly through the adoption of villages for targeted TB interventions.

100-Day TB Elimination Campaign:

Launched on December 7, 2024, this focused 100-day campaign aims to accelerate the fight against TB by improving case detection, reducing diagnostic delays, and enhancing treatment outcomes, particularly in the 347 most affected districts. The initiative includes awareness campaigns, screenings, and referrals to make TB elimination a community priority.

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) is a flagship program initiated by the Government of India to promote sustainable development in rural areas by leveraging the expertise of higher educational institutions. The program encourages these institutions to adopt villages and contribute to their holistic development.

Adopted Villages and Participating Institutes:

As of the latest available data, UBA has engaged 4,035 active institutes, covering 592 districts and 14,787 Gram Panchayats, impacting 19,024 villages and 566,204 households across India.

Activities and Initiatives:

Participating institutes conduct various activities in adopted villages, including:

- **Surveys and Awareness Programs:** Institutes perform baseline surveys to assess the needs of the villages and organize awareness campaigns on health, hygiene, sanitation, and environmental conservation. For instance, Gautam college of pharmacy in Himachal Pradesh adopted five villages—Bajuri Khas, Dugnehri, Dulhera, Nijhar, Baral and initiated health and hygiene talks.

Guidelines and Initiatives:

1. **Programmatic Management of TB Preventive Treatment (PMTPT):** The Indian government has developed guidelines for the systematic management of TB preventive treatment. These guidelines aim to standardize preventive measures across the country, ensuring consistent and effective TB control strategies.
2. **Community-Based Approaches:** Studies have demonstrated the effectiveness of community-based models in TB detection, treatment, and prevention. In GCOP, five villages adoption model was implemented, involving trained village TB volunteers who conducted symptom screening, facilitated diagnostic services, and provided treatment support. This approach led to improved TB detection rates and treatment adherence.

Village 3) Dulhera

3. **Operation ASHA:** This non-profit organization focuses on delivering TB treatment to underserved communities. By establishing DOTS (Directly Observed Treatment, Short-Course) centers in accessible locations like shops and temples, Operation ASHA reduces stigma and enhances treatment adherence. Their model includes employing local community health workers who understand cultural nuances, thereby improving patient engagement and outcomes.

4. **National Tuberculosis Elimination Program (NTEP):** Formerly known as the Revised National Tuberculosis Control Program (RNTCP), NTEP is the central framework for TB control in India. It provides free, quality TB diagnosis and treatment services nationwide, emphasizing the integration of TB services into the general healthcare system and community participation.

Impact and Outcomes:

Implementing these community-driven initiatives has led to significant reductions in TB prevalence. For instance, in Arunachal Pradesh, 70 villages were declared TB-free in 2023, demonstrating the effectiveness of localized, community-based strategies.
