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1. Introduction

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) is an initiative of the Government of India aimed at enabling higher educational institutions to contribute to the sustainable development of rural areas. As part of the UBA activities, village visits were conducted to understand the socio-economic conditions, population details, basic facilities, education system, and implementation of government schemes in the adopted villages.

2. Duration of the Study

The village visits and field interactions were carried out during the period **September 2025 to December 2025**.

3. Villages Visited

The following villages were visited under the UBA program:

1. Mamdapur
2. Arlibenchi
3. Asapur
4. Nelhal

Meetings and discussions were held with the **Panchayat Development Officer (PDO) Smt. Nagarathna** of the respective villages.

4. Team Involved

The village visits were conducted under the guidance of:

- **UBA Nodal Officer:** *Dr. M. Ravi*
- **PDO:** *Smt. Nagarathna*

The activities were supported by **five UBA student volunteers from Government First Grade College, Raichur**.



5. Objectives of the Visit

- To study the general profile of the villages
- To understand population characteristics and livelihood patterns
- To assess available facilities and infrastructure
- To review the educational status of the villages
- To discuss the implementation of government schemes

6. Village Profile and Population

Information regarding population size, number of households, and occupational patterns was provided by the PDO. Agriculture and allied activities were the main sources of livelihood in all four villages. Some residents were also engaged in daily wage labor and small-scale businesses.

7. Facilities Available in the Villages

The following facilities were observed and discussed:

- **Drinking water facilities** through borewells and overhead tanks
- **Electricity supply** available in most households
- **Road connectivity**, with scope for improvement in internal village roads
- **Health facilities**, mainly Primary Health Centres (PHCs) and sub-centres
- **Sanitation facilities**, including household toilets constructed under the Swachh Bharat Mission

8. Educational Status

Each village has access to **primary-level educational institutions**, while secondary and higher education facilities are available in nearby towns. Issues such as school dropouts, limited digital learning resources, and transportation challenges for higher education were discussed. Awareness regarding government scholarships and educational schemes was also reviewed.

9. Government Schemes

The PDO explained the status of implementation of various government schemes, including:

- Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS)
- Swachh Bharat Mission
- Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana
- Old Age Pension, Widow Pension, and Disability Pension schemes
- Schemes related to agriculture, education, and health

Efforts were being made to ensure effective implementation, though challenges such as awareness and timely benefits were noted.

10. Observations and Findings

- Basic infrastructure is available in all villages, but improvements are required in roads and healthcare facilities
- Awareness of government schemes needs to be further strengthened
- Educational facilities exist, but access to higher education remains limited
- The role of the PDO and UBA team is crucial in addressing village-level issues

11. Conclusion

The UBA village visits to Mamdapur, Arlibenchi, Asapur, and Nelhal provided valuable insights into rural development and governance. The interaction with **PDO Smt. Nagarathna**, under the guidance of **UBA Nodal Officer Dr. M. Ravi**, and the active participation of **five UBA volunteers from Government First Grade College, Raichur**, helped in understanding the ground realities of village life and government scheme implementation. These visits will contribute to planning future UBA initiatives for sustainable rural development.
