Say No to Child Labour



On 5th February, the AIMT UBA Cell organized a Child Labour Awareness Programme in Saithali Village, the adopted village of the institute. The programme aimed to create awareness among villagers about the harmful effects of child labour and the importance of providing children with education and a safe childhood.

The activity was conducted under the guidance of the UBA Programme Coordinator, with active participation from UBA volunteers. To spread the message effectively, the students performed a skit (nukkad natak) in front of the village residents. The skit portrayed the harsh realities faced by children involved in labour, highlighting how child labour deprives children of education, health, and overall development.

Through meaningful scenes and dialogues, the skit emphasized the legal and moral responsibility of society to protect children's rights and ensure their access to education. The performance also conveyed the long-term negative impact of child labour on society and the nation's progress.

Villagers, including parents and youth, gathered to watch the skit and showed keen interest in the topic. After the performance, UBA volunteers interacted with the villagers and encouraged them to support children's education and report cases of child labour.
