1. Executive Summary

This report presents the findings of a **Household Baseline Survey** conducted on **3rd November 2025** in the UBA adopted villages **Rampura and Sewapura**. The UBA team from **Mehta College and Institute of Technology**, comprising **Dr. Pankaj Kumar Soni** (**Principal & UBA Coordinator**), 15 students, and faculty members, carried out the survey to assess socioeconomic conditions and developmental needs.

A meeting with **Gram Sachiv Shri Rakesh Sharma** was conducted, during which valuable feedback regarding the villages' current status and areas for improvement was shared.

2. Introduction

Under the **Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA)**, **Mehta College and Institute of Technology** has adopted **Rampura** and **Sewapura** villages for rural development. The objective of the baseline survey was to gather data on the socio-economic conditions, identify infrastructural gaps, and assess the developmental needs of these villages to design future interventions.

3. Objectives of the Survey

The main objectives of the survey were:

- To gather data on the socio-economic status of households in Rampura and Sewapura.
- To identify key infrastructure needs and development challenges.
- To gather baseline data for designing UBA interventions.
- To engage with the community and local authorities for feedback.

4. Methodology

5. Key Findings

Socio-Economic Status:

- The majority of households depend on agriculture and daily wage labor.
- Literacy rates are moderate, with a higher dropout rate among girls due to economic and social reasons.

Infrastructure Needs:

- There is an urgent need for proper sanitation and access to safe drinking water.
- Poor road connectivity, especially in remote areas.

Educational Facilities:

- Local schools lack infrastructure and qualified teachers.
- Limited availability of educational resources, especially for digital learning.

Healthcare:

- Inadequate healthcare facilities, with no regular medical check-ups.
- A large portion of the population lacks access to health insurance or financial support for medical treatment.

6. Feedback from Gram Sachiv Shri Rakesh Sharma

During the survey meeting with **Gram Sachiv Shri Rakesh Sharma**, he provided the following feedback:

- A strong emphasis on improving basic infrastructure, including water supply and sanitation.
- A request for greater educational support, especially for girls and underprivileged students.
- Highlighted the need for mobile medical units or regular health camps.
- Suggested that more youth engagement activities be organized for skill development and community participation.

7. Recommendations

Based on the survey findings and feedback from **Gram Sachiv Shri Rakesh Sharma**, the following recommendations are proposed:

1. Infrastructure Development:

- o Improve sanitation and drinking water facilities.
- o Strengthen road connectivity in rural areas.

2. Educational Improvements:

- o Provide digital resources and educational materials to local schools.
- o Organize workshops for teachers to improve their teaching skills.

3. Healthcare Initiatives:

- o Set up regular health camps and mobile healthcare units.
- o Conduct health awareness campaigns focusing on hygiene and preventive care.

4. Community Engagement:

- o Organize skill development programs and vocational training for the youth.
- o Involve the local community in identifying and solving issues.

8. Conclusion

The baseline survey in **Rampura** and **Sewapura** has provided critical insights into the needs and challenges faced by the villagers. These findings will serve as the foundation for future development activities under the **Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA)**. The feedback from **Gram Sachiv Shri Rakesh Sharma** will guide the direction of UBA interventions to ensure they are community-driven and meet the villagers' most pressing needs.
