Preface

Waste is quite a complex problem. But the solution is simple. It is simple if you and I stopped indiscriminate chucking of waste; if you and I slightly redesign our lifestyles; and if you and I influenced ten others to become swachh citizens. Each leaf of this little palm book comes with one actionable idea. The suggestions are so well-known, one could say, perhaps in typical American accent: 'I know all these stuff'. Our purpose here is not creating awareness, rather prodding people into action. This is second in the 'Awareness to Practice' series of CRI, NIRD&PR on waste management. Talking is not doing. Let's demonstrate.

'stop wasting food' – at home, at restaurants, at buffet dinners - and always.

carry our own cloth bag for shopping, and say NO to use-and-throw carry bags.

carry our own refillable water bottles instead of buying packaged water bottles on travel.

take up home-composting of kitchen waste, and walk with a glow of pride for having reduced nearly 50% of the waste, which otherwise the Gram Panchayat or the Municipality has to handle.

segregate waste (as wet, dry and hazardous) at the household level before passing it on to the waste collection system of the Panchayat or Municipality.

stop supporting roadside eateries
that generate tons of garbage and
go off counting the day's profit
unmindful of the trash one has caused
enter the sewerage system.

commit to slow the flow while taking bath (or use a shower head), and switch off lights, fans, and air-conditioners while leaving our rooms.

care to pass on plastic and other recyclable items to the recyclers / rag pickers. Care to wash milk covers. aluminium packs / foils from restaurants, refill oil covers etc. before passing them on for recycling.

stop impulse buying, and go to shop with a shopping list (Refuse / Reduce)

assimilate and foster the culture of reuse and take responsibility for sending recyclables for recycling (Reuse / Recycle)

persuade the retailers to have a Drop Box in their premises for you to deposit the plastic carry bags they handed you last time of course imprudently, packing each item of vegetable in separate plastic carry bags so that it is easy for them to bill.

organize 'Annual Yard Sale'
in a commonplace, where items you
wish to discard can be put on display for
anyone who might need, to take for free;
or for a throw-away price.
