

Progress Report UBA, RCI, IIT(BHU)

Progress of the UBA organized under RCI (IIT, BHU) is as follows:

Highlights of the Report:

- 1. Two meeting have been organized so far, for PI at IIT(BHU), first in the month of May and second in the month of November.*
- 2. There were 37 participants in first meeting and 31 in second meeting, this meeting was taken by Dr. Vivek Kumar, national Dy. Coordinator, UBA, IIT(Delhi).*
- 3. First meeting was basically to sensitize the PI's to join UBA, and their participation for the society in larger order however in the second meeting was much beneficial which encouraged each PI, helped in solving technical problems and encourage new college to join.*
- 4. Till October there were 50 participants and around 15 were in the process of joining.*
- 5. Till now there are all together 63 PI under the umbrella of RCI, IIT(BHU)*
- 6. More than 10 colleges are in direct touch to join soon and many other are in queue due to some technical issues it taking time to join and data upload.*
- 7. Now Educational institutions have started showing their interest to join UBA for the betterment of society as well as their own benefit.*
- 8. Physical visit of new colleges by the RCI, IIT (BHU) have been started to speed up the UBA work and activities at different PI level.*

Detailed Progress Report:

Progress of the UBA organized under RCI (IIT, BHU) is as follows:

Till the month May around 50 Participating institutions have been added to the list and presently there are 53 participating institutions. Participation and joining related issues were entertained and fixed up through proper and regular communication at regular interval.

One day meeting was organized by IIT (BHU) for participating institution and Regional coordinator institute (RCI) for awareness about UBA and having more clarity on different aspects of UBA.



Meeting was taken by Dr. vivek Kumar national Dy. Coordinator Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, IIT(Delhi)
Dr. Vivek discussed basically about funding and convergence possibilities- different Central and State Scheme and Programs of the government for the development of villages of India.



10 new PIs were added till October, 2019 due to regular conversation with them and around 8-12 colleges were in line to join.

PIs were ensured in the meeting that how they can play role in the development of their adopted villages.



In the month of November, 2019 another one day meeting and orientation programme was organized by Regional Coordinating Institution (UBA), Indian Institute of Technology (Banaras Hindu University), for participating Institution at IIT(BHU), on 15th November,2019.



After formal inaugural, discussion was started by Dr. Priyanka Kaushal, IIT(Delhi), she thoroughly discussed about technical issues related to registration, joining of new PI, issue of initial fund transfer to PI's, funding of different projects useful for development of villages by UBA and different other agencies, different issues and difficulties related to data uploading etc.



Meeting was convened by Dr. Ruchir Gupta, Dy. Coordinator, UBA, RCI, IIT(BHU). There were 31 participants including Dr. Sanjay Kumar Singh, UBA, Coordinator, IIIT(Allahabad), Prayagraj, Dr. Satish Kanaujia from IIT(BHU), Dr. Richa Mishra from Arya Mahila PG College, Varanasi, Dr. Anurika Vaish form IIIT(Allahabad), Prayagraj etc. and different coordinators and sub coordinators from distinguish PI's of the Purvanchal region.



The meeting was held to discuss the progress and development made by different PI till date and difficulties faced in the process. All participants discussed their progress and contribution made for the villages adopted and difficulties being faced.

7-10 new PIs were added during October-November, 2019, by regular communication and persuasion with many new PI's are in line to join UBA and agree to work effectively with UBA for better development of Bharat. currently there are 60 PI under RCI, IIT(BHU).



Prof. Vivek shared how to involve all technical and non-technical institution with UBA, development of UBA have been put forward by different PI's, villagers and people and not only by MHRD. He also shared the new initiative of UBA like, Tech for sewa, Rural internship programme, Rural and swadeshi meet, Jal Shakti abhiyan and single use plastic free society.



Prof. Vivek further emphasis on the fact that, contribution of participating institution should not be limited to data collection and survey of villages rather doing some tangible activates for the betterment of the village adopted and ultimately for the society as whole.



It was decided that RCI, IIT(BHU) will rigorously work on Jal Shakti Abhiyan, Single use plastic free abhiyan, and waste management for the effective implementation of UBA in the society for healthy, wealthy, prosperous and developed Bharat.
