ACTIVITY 1:

Title of the Activity: Free Medical Camps in Villages

Need of the Activity:

Due to long distance and less connectivity to urban area ,villagers are depend on medicines made from forest and local trees which takes time to cure or didn't work .

Brief Description (Need/Impact/Action/Picture (if any)):

We organize free medical check-up camps for Stone, Jaundice, Skin diseases, Malaria, Typhoid, Piles, Asthma, Blood Pressure, Gynic problems, etc. In such camps we provide free homeopathic medicines to the patients also.



ACTIVITY 2:

Title of the Activity: Workshop on village level organic farming

Need of the Activity:

Organic farming practices reduce pollution, conserve water, reduce soil erosion, increase soil fertility, and use less energy. Farming without pesticides is also better for nearby birds and animals as well as people who live close to farms.

In this workshop, training provided for practical how-to information on systemic and biological approaches including: rotations, weed seed-bank reduction, stale beds, fertility and tilth, predation and allelopathy, living mulch, canopy and niche in relation to the agronomic principles of an organic farming system.

ACTIVITY 5:

Title of the Activity: Extension Lectures on water conservation and promotion

Need of the Activity:

Water Conservation is one of the greatest issues of the time both in the rural areas as well as the urban areas. There is extreme need of awareness and promotion of conservation of water. Having clean drinking water is also a challenge. However, India has enough rains, But most of that water flows down into the sea taking with it the fertile top soil. There are technologies available, both in the modern sector as well as in the traditional sector for better water conservation. Therefore, this extension lecture is organized by the UBA team of our University.

Brief Description (Need/Impact/Action/Picture (if any)):

Magsaysay Award-winning "Waterman" Rajendra Singh has been invited to deliver the lecture on 'Extension Lectures on water conservation and promotion'. He said that if we do not warn about the environment in time, the consequences will be terrible. He also said that we should come forward to save water, forest and land. If water, forest and land are not saved then our life will not be saved. The way we are waging with the environment, water, air is changing at a rapid rate, due to which dryness is causing havoc. Presiding Vice Chancellor Prof. S.S. Sarangadevot said that the original impact of rivers can be saved by indigenous systems. He conveyed that earlier water needs of the people were fulfilled by rivers and ponds, but now these sources have become polluted or are over. In such a situation, dependence on ground water has become the first requirement of the people.
