The students took enough effort to find out the major problems prevailing in and around the villages. The problems faced by the villagers were listed out in the following activity.

Activity 2 : Situation analysis

Based on the survey, the following problems were identified from the adopted villages.

1. It has been found out that there are no proper street light in the villages which affects the villagers in their emergency situation.
2. The people are struggling a lot by the improper drainage structure and system. There is block in the drainage system and hence there is no proper facility for waste water outlet which causes viral infections.
3. The natives are also affected by the lack of road facility to reach the town. There is no proper maintenance of panchayat roads. Ultimately it affects their education level of the village children.
4. As there is no proper conveyance to the city and the transport timing also improper, the natives are not able to schedule their work properly. It affects their occupation which lowers their standard of living.
5. There is no proper water supply and the water supply timing has not been scheduled properly.
6. Since most of the people are below the poverty line, they were not able construct toilets in their houses. Initiatives should be taken to construct and maintain common toilets in their area.
7. Bus stop renovation was requested by the villagers.
