Activity 4:

Field Survey

Our institution's UBA volunteers initiated the data collection for Baseline Household Survey form. The faculty members those who guided the team met the village Panchayat President and gathered information regarding fertile area, conveyance, basic amenities, population and their standard of living. The students were divided into five teams and deputed to collect information such as their sanitary facilities, educational qualification, water facility, land holding details and livestock numbers from the natives of the adopted villages.

The volunteers reached the door steps of the villagers to collect the data. They drafted the list of individual beneficiaries of PM Yojanas in various aspects. Besides, the volunteers assessed the standard of living of the native people through the criteria given in the Baseline Household Survey form.

Activity 5 : Baseline Household survey

The Baseline Household survey was continued further by our volunteers.

The students took enough effort to find out the major problems prevailing in and around the villages. The problems faced by the villagers were listed out in the following activity.

Activity 6 : Situation analysis

Based on the survey, the following problems were identified from the adopted villages.

1. It has been found out that there are no proper street light in the villages which affects the villagers in their emergency situation.

- 2. The people are struggling a lot by the improper drainage structure and system. There is block in the drainage system and hence there is no proper facility for waste water outlet which causes viral infections.
- 3. The natives are also affected by the lack of road facility to reach the town. There is no proper maintenance of panchayat roads. Ultimately it affects their education level of the village children.
- 4. As there is no proper conveyance to the city and the transport timing also improper, the natives are not able to schedule their work properly. It affects their occupation which lowers their standard of living.
- 5. There is no proper water supply and the water supply timing has not been scheduled properly.
- 6. Since most of the people are below the poverty line, they were not able construct toilets in their houses. Initiatives should be taken to construct and maintain common toilets in their area.
- 7. Bus stop renovation was requested by the villagers.

Activity 7:

Awareness rally on Voting rights

Right to vote is something that no one can deny to an individual. As to the quote, our institution's UBA volunteers conducted a voter awareness rally in the adopted villages to educate the people regarding the importance of voting on 27.01.2023.

Activity 8:

Health campaign

Deworming tablets were issued to the public to diagnose and treat the hook and roundworm infections to improve their health condition.

Activity 11:

Eye Camp

In order to improve health and hygiene of the villagers, an eye camp was arranged in collaboration with Arasan Eye Hospital, Erode at Kandampalayam. A team of doctors were deputed by the hospital for the camp. The pamphlets were

distributed in the previous week to the public. On 04.10.2023 the camp conducted from the early morning. The doctors and nurses initiated the camp by checking the vision of the villagers. Free consultation was provided to the public. The tablets and ointments were distributed to the affected people.
