Report of the event-

GIPS has organized an awareness program under the campaign of Unnat Bharat Abhiyaan in association with IIC clubs. Awareness campaign was created among the students of government school at Pipal Ka, Salempur Gurjar regarding "Exposure and field visit for problem identification in the Rural India" Students of GIPS from all the Commerce streams presented questionnaire problem identification in rural area.

Firstly, establishing mobile healthcare units to provide basic **medical services** and conducting **health awareness** programs can address the healthcare gap. For education, implementing technology-driven learning solutions and collaborating with NGOs for resource mobilization can enhance educational access. Moreover, creating skill development programs, promoting entrepreneurship, and encouraging sustainable agricultural practices can contribute to generating **employment opportunities**.



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Infrastructure development projects, including road construction and sanitation facilities, are essential for improving overall living conditions.

In conclusion, the visit to **Pipal Ka Salempur Gurjar** has illuminated key challenges, and the proposed solutions aim to empower the community and pave the way for holistic rural development. This experience underscored the importance of bridging the urban-rural divide and fostering inclusive growth for a prosperous future.
