Online Session on “Covid Vaccination: Myths and Reality” in Villages: Buterla, Badheri and Attawa

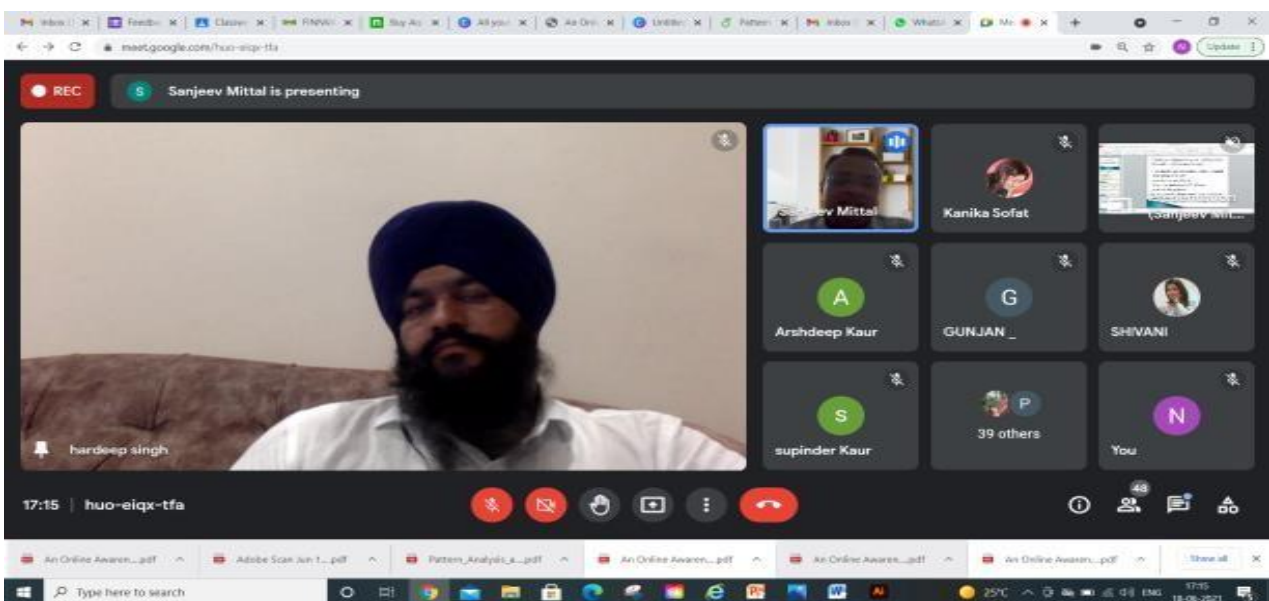

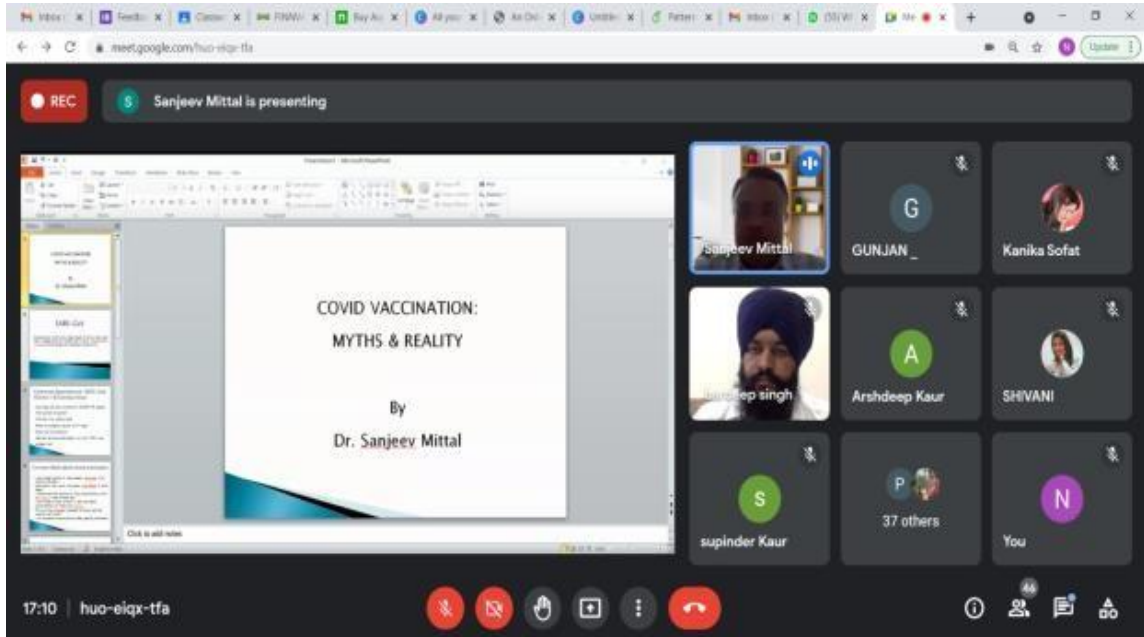
Need of the Activity: As a part of the Campaign celebrating “75th Bharat Amrit Mahotsav”, the UBA team of the college, led by the village in-charges of villages Buterla, Badheri and Attawa and assisted by the UBA student volunteers of the College, conducted a one-hour online session on “Covid Vaccination: Myths and Reality” on 18 June, 2021. The prime objective of the session was to disseminate awareness regarding the myths associated with the administration of Covid 19 vaccine and to clear the doubts of the people, address their queries and apprise them with factual information regarding the causes, symptoms and remedies available to combat Covid 19.

Description in 200 words (along with the Pictures): The Resource person, Dr Sanjeev Mittal, a renowned cardiologist of the tricity, gave a detailed visual explanation of the causes, symptoms and remedies of Covid 19. He highlighted the application of risk and benefit approach to expedite the vaccination drive and attain synergetic effects. He addressed various queries of the participants regarding the myths and facts of Covid vaccine with clinical data and information.

The special invitee at the webinar was Shri Hardeep Singh, Councillor of the three villages viz. Buterla, Badheri and Attawa who expressed the need to have a restoration of humanitarian deeds of kindness especially in the post-Covid phase. Shri Hardeep Singh suggested the organization of a covid vaccination camp in his villages. His recommendation was supported by Dr. Gunjan, Coordinator, UBA Cell of the college.

There were over 80 participants in the session including teachers of Govt. school, Buterla, residents of the villages, and student volunteers of the UBA Cell of the college. The session concluded on a satisfactory note with a recharged spirit to combat Covid19 by promoting vaccination drives along with a continued adherence to the three-pronged safety protocol.

Mission 1 Lakh TRIVENI - Plantation at Various Places

Date: 21 June – 07 July 2021

Description: Mission-1 Lakh Triveni was inaugurated by Swachhta Committee, in collaboration with Pranjai Genus Pvt. Ltd. in the college on 21.06.2021. Triveni is the trio of three plants viz. neem tree (*Azadirachta indica*), peepal (*Ficus religiosa*), and bohar (*Ficus benghalensis*) all planted together in one pit. The Triveni produces a large amount of oxygen and purifies the environment. It also controls soil erosion, improves soil health and structure, and induces rainfall apart from its immense medicinal properties. Keeping up the lofty eco-friendly targets as proposed by the mission, the UBA Cell of the College is making rapid strides in upholding the banner of a cleaner environment by promoting the plantation of Triveni in its areas of jurisdiction.

The village activities falling in the ambit of UBA, took forward the mission, with UBA coordinator Dr. Gunjan planting 3 sets of Triveni in Sunny Enclave, Kharar; Attawa village incharge Dr. Kanika Sofat planting 1 set in Panjab University Campus; and Badheri village team headed by Dr. Nidhi Tanwar planting 1 set each in the park of sector 13, Chandigarh; phase 4 and Sohana village of Mohali.

CHANDIGARH: Inaugurating 'Mission 1 Lakh Triveni', the Swachhta Committee of Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, Chandigarh carried out plantation of Triveni in the college campus, in collaboration with Pranjai Genus Pvt. Ltd. Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava, along with the officials of Pranjai Genus Pvt. Ltd. and Coordinators of Swachhta Committee, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) Cell, NSS units, Artificial Forest and Horticulture Committee, planted Triveni- the trio of three plants viz. neem tree (*Azadirachta indica*), peepal (*Ficus religiosa*) and banyan (*Ficus benghalensis*), planted together in one pit. Speaking on this occasion, Dr. Bhargava said that besides having ecological importance, triveni also holds spiritual significance as banyan, neem and peepal are regarded as the abode of Lord Brahma, Vishnu and Mahesh, respectively.

The team also distributed the masks prepared by the students amongst the village residents. The extra materials were also shared with them so that they could prepare the masks at their own comfort.

This informative and highly beneficial activity not only addressed the issue of the importance of preparing face masks at home, but also generated a sense of concern and compassion towards the people around us.
