Introduction

This small, isolated island houses a temple where rituals are conducted, but it lacks a bridge connection and is accessible only by boat. The island, rich in biodiversity, is home to various species of flora and fauna. Recognizing its ecological and cultural significance, the Department of Biodiversity, Government of Kerala, has initiated

steps to declare the island a heritage site and protect its natural ecosystem by planting mangroves.

3. **Support for Biodiversity Survey and Conservation Efforts**

The UBA Cell of Sree Narayana Training College extended its support to the biodiversity survey conducted on the island. Student-teachers assisted in documenting the island's rich biodiversity, providing crucial data for conservation planning. Additionally, they joined hands with local authorities and the Gram Panchayat in planting mangroves, contributing to the restoration of the island's natural habitat and enhancing its ecological resilience.

4. **Plastic-Free Green Tourism Declaration**

A key highlight of the day was the *declaration of Golden Island as a plastic-free green tourism destination*. The student-teachers participated in cleaning activities on the island, removing plastic waste and other pollutants to restore its pristine environment. This initiative aimed to promote sustainable tourism practices and raise awareness about the harmful impact of plastic pollution. By collaborating with local stakeholders, the UBA Cell played a pivotal role in making the island a model for eco-friendly tourism in the village.

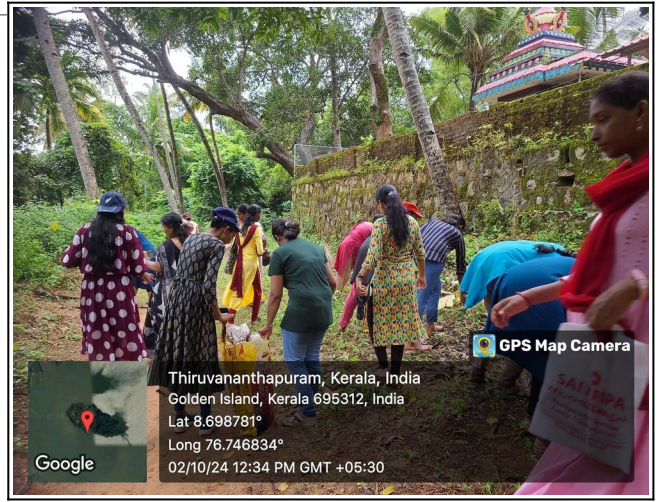
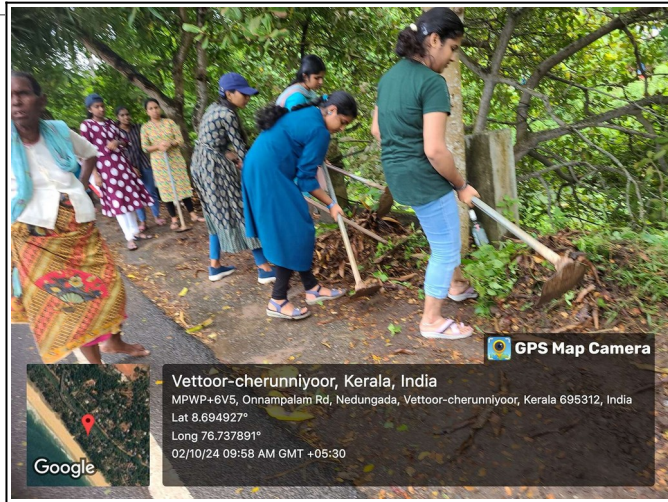
Outcomes and Impact
