



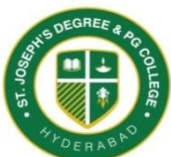
This medical camp is open to all members of the community, especially those in need. Individuals of all age groups are welcome to attend and take advantage of the free medical services provided.

## **Detailed Report**

A **Free Medical Camp** was successfully conducted on **5th April** from **10:00 AM to 1:00 PM** at **Turban Community Hall, Amberpet, Hyderabad**, with a focus on serving the residents of **Amberpet and Sarfekas**. The camp was organized to provide essential healthcare services to underprivileged sections of the community who often lack access to regular medical facilities. The initiative aimed to promote preventive healthcare, offer medical consultations, and raise awareness about common health issues.

The event saw active participation from local healthcare professionals, volunteers, and community members. A team of **qualified doctor**, along with **four nurses** and **ten volunteers**, worked tirelessly to attend to patients. The services provided included general health checkups, blood sugar testing, pediatric and gynecological consultations, basic eye checkup and ECG Testing was also made. Health awareness sessions were also conducted to educate people on topics such as personal hygiene, nutrition, lifestyle diseases, and the importance of early diagnosis.

Approximately **40 residents** from Amberpet and Sarfekas availed the benefits of the camp. The camp catered to a wide range of age groups, including children, adults, and the elderly. Special attention was given to senior citizens and women, ensuring their health concerns were addressed with care. Several previously undiagnosed cases of hypertension, diabetes, and vision problems were identified, and appropriate referrals were suggested for further treatment. One of the residents is living with only one kidney and her problem was diagnosed and suggestions were given by the doctor.

While the event was a great success, some challenges were encountered. These challenges highlighted the strong demand for medical outreach in the area and the necessity of planning for a larger setup in future camps.

In conclusion, the free medical camp at Amberpet was a meaningful step toward community well-being. It brought timely medical support to those in need and fostered greater health awareness among the residents. The camp was well-received by the public and appreciated by the local leaders, further emphasizing the importance of continuing such health initiatives regularly. The organizers extended their heartfelt thanks to all the medical professionals, volunteers, and supporters who contributed to the success of this noble cause.
