

| <i>Description of event</i>   | <p>The Department of English, in collaboration with ISREAC/UBA, conducted a <b>certificate course in Elementary English</b> for students of Mahatma Gandhi Govt. School, Khatwara. Interactive sessions were held with students from grades VI–VIII, led by B.A. (Hons) English students under the coordination of Dr. Rama Hirawat.</p> <p>The curriculum blended grammar instruction—covering nouns, verbs, adjectives, adverbs, conjunctions, prepositions, gender, synonyms/antonyms, tenses, and articles—with practical, engaging exercises. Classes incorporated games, quizzes, worksheets, and group activities to reinforce learning in a fun, participatory environment. Students completed homework assignments to deepen their grasp of grammar concepts. A final assessment on October 4 evaluated both written understanding and oral communication through an exit test and speaking skills test. Participants showed notable enthusiasm, improvement in grammar accuracy, and stronger reading and recitation skills. On October 5, a formal closing ceremony awarded certificates and trophies to coordinators, instructors, and top-performing students across grades VI–VIII. Overall, the course successfully enhanced foundational English proficiency while fostering confidence and engagement among the village school students.</p> |





**शिविर में 45 यूनिट रक्त एकत्रित**

| <i>Description of event</i>   | <p>Ordered under the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan's People's Plan Campaign, higher education institutions were required to attend a special Gram Sabha on 2 October 2024, focused on initiating Panchayat Development Plan (GPDP) preparations for FY 2025–26.</p> <p>Seventeen students from the Department of Political Science, accompanied by Mr. Surendra Singh Chauhan and Dr. Mamta Pareek (ISREAC/UBA coordinators), attended the Gram Sabha at Mahapura Gram Panchayat to provide on-site support to local officials.</p> <p>The Sarpanch, Shri Hanuman Kharbas, and the Gram Sachiv introduced attendees to Gram Sabha's aims, GPDP procedures, and community mobilization strategies. Students learned about participatory steps such as setting vision, identifying priorities, and the core components of GPDP. During the session, students supported planning discussions by helping document issues, encouraging participation from all sections—including vulnerable groups like women and elderly—and understanding facilitation roles outlined in national GPDP frameworks. The Gandhi Jayanti Gram Sabha visit effectively merged academic learning with civic engagement. Students gained firsthand experience in village governance and GPDP development, strengthening their capacity to act as social change facilitators and contributing meaningfully to the Panchayat planning process.</p> |

Dear Madam/Sir,

As you are aware, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) is a program launched by the Union Ministry of Education, aimed at involving faculty and students from Higher Education institutions and to leverage the knowledge and skills of these institutions to enhance the effectiveness of Government Programs. Coordinated by IIT Delhi, UBA operates through a network of 50 Regional Coordinating Institutes (RCIs) and includes 3,802 Participating Institutes (PIs) across the country.

2. To enhance the impact of the UBA, IIT Delhi and the Ministry of Panchayati Raj are collaborating to involve students in the planning processes at the grassroots level. This initiative will help in engaging students to actively participate in People's Plan Campaign (PPC), being launched on 2<sup>nd</sup> October, 2024, and support Gram Panchayats (GPs) in preparation of their Gram Panchayat Development Plans (GPDPs).

3. Around 20000 students from UBA Institutions are expected to physically attend the Special Gram Sabha on 2<sup>nd</sup> October, 2024. These students will also provide handholding supports to the GPs in entire process of preparation of GPDP of 2025-26. Gram Panchayats may continue their engagement with students, invite them for Gram Sabhas scheduled for finalizing GPDP and partner for handholding support.

4. It has been decided that to facilitate visit by these students to the GPs for active participation during the campaign, a token travel allowance of ₹200 may be paid from already approved Annual Action Plan of Revamped Rashtriya Gram Swaraj Abhiyan (RSSA) from the State Components of Handholding Support to GPs / Information, Education and Communication (IEC) Project Management.

5. I, therefore, would be grateful necessary direction to the Gram Panchayats for organizing special Gram Sabha on 2<sup>nd</sup> October and involve the visiting students to support in preparation of quality GPDP and make payment of their travel allowance immediately at the end of Gram Sabha. The list of GPs with the mapping of institutions/ students of your State is annexed.

- Students, in collaboration with community elders, will document local success stories, folk tales, and village histories
