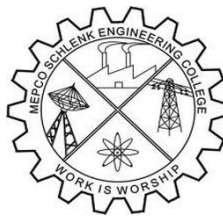

Introduction

On 16th February 2025, an NSS (National Service Scheme) Medical and Eye Camp was successfully organized in Muthalipatti Village, Virudhunagar. The camp was conducted by Mathi Integrated Health Centre Pvt Ltd, Sivakasi, and Dr. Anil Kumar's Eye Hospital, Sivakasi, with the support of the Civil and Mechanical Engineering Departments of Mepco Schlenk Engineering College, Sivakasi. The initiative aimed to provide essential medical and eye care services to the underserved villagers. The primary objective of this camp was to provide free medical check-ups and eye care services to the residents of Muthalipatti village, a rural area with limited access to healthcare. The event aimed to promote health awareness, offer consultations, and distribute free medicines to those in need.

Activities Conducted

- **General Medical Check-ups:** The medical team from Mathi Integrated Health Centre offered general health check-ups, which included blood pressure monitoring, diabetes screening, and consultations for common ailments.

- **Distribution of Medicines:** Free medicines were distributed to the villagers based on the diagnoses, addressing minor health issues like headaches, fever, and common infections.
- **Health Awareness:** Students and medical professionals conducted health education sessions on hygiene, sanitation, and preventive healthcare practices, aiming to enhance awareness about basic health maintenance in the village.
- **Eye Health Education:** The eye care team also raised awareness about common eye conditions, such as cataracts and refractive errors, and encouraged villagers to seek timely treatment.

Participation

Activities Conducted

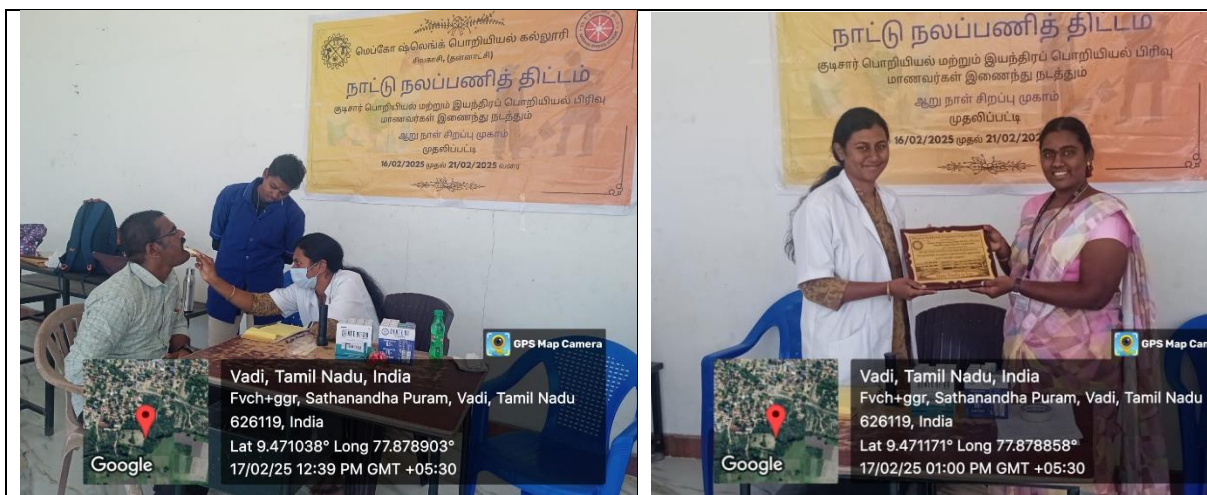

Introduction

The Fire Safety Awareness Program was conducted on 19 th February 2025 at **S.A.V.SALA Middle School, Muthalipatti Village, Sivakasi** to educate students about fire safety, prevention, and emergency response. The program aimed to equip students with practical knowledge and skills to handle fire-related emergencies effectively.

Programmes Involved

Understanding Fire Hazards

Students were shown various fire hazards commonly found in schools and homes. The facilitator discussed unsafe practices, such as overloading electrical outlets and improper storage of flammable materials. Students participated in identifying potential hazards in their surroundings.

Fire Prevention Tips

The facilitator provided practical tips for preventing fires, including:

- Not playing with matches or lighters.
- Keeping flammable materials away from heat sources.
- Reporting any hazards to an adult. Students were encouraged to share their own tips and experiences related to fire safety.

Emergency Procedures

The school's fire evacuation plan was explained in detail. Students learned about designated exit routes, assembly points, and the importance of remaining calm during an emergency. The facilitator emphasized the need to follow instructions from teachers and staff during a fire drill.

Practical Guidance and Demonstrations

Fire Extinguisher Training: A certified fire safety officer demonstrated the proper use of a fire extinguisher using the PASS method (Pull, Aim, Squeeze, Sweep). Students had the opportunity to practice using a fire extinguisher on a simulated fire.

- Evacuation Drill: A fire drill was conducted to practice evacuation procedures. Students exited the building in an orderly manner, following their teachers to the designated assembly point.
- Stop, Drop, and Roll: Students were taught this technique for extinguishing flames on clothing. They practiced the technique in small groups.

First Aid Basics

A brief session on basic first aid for fire-related injuries was conducted. Students learned how to treat minor burns and when to seek medical help. The importance of not using water on certain types of burns (e.g., chemical burns) was emphasized.

Impacts

The Fire Safety Awareness Program conducted for school students had a significant impact on enhancing their knowledge, skills, and attitudes toward fire safety. Students gained a comprehensive understanding of fire hazards, prevention methods, and emergency procedures, which fostered a culture of safety within the school. 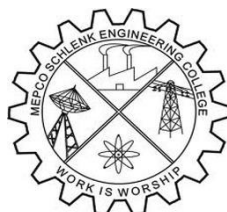

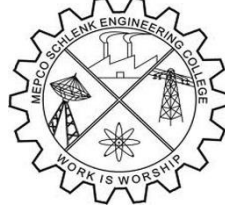
Day 6 (21/02/2023-Friday):

Day 3 (18-02-2025):

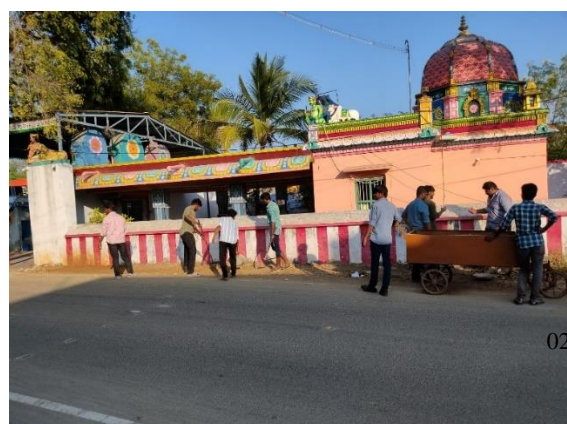

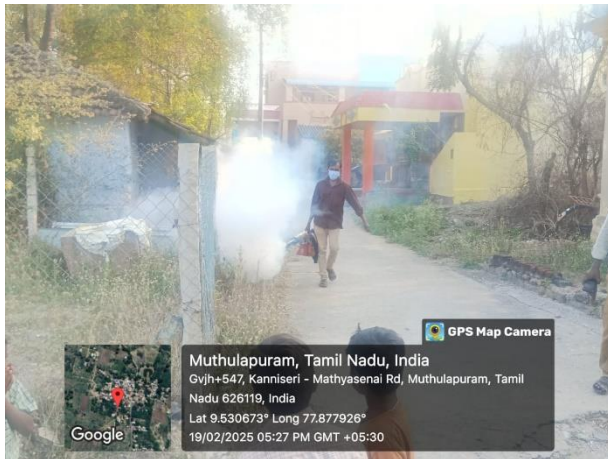


Day 4 (19-02-2025):

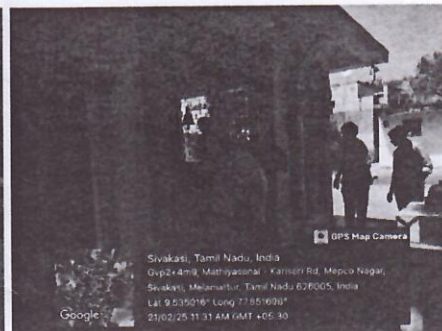
DAY 5 (20/02/2025)
