The following events were successfully organized by Unnat Bharat Abhiyan JUIT in Academic Year 2023-2024:

1. Chawsa Village Visit: 22 April, 2023:

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA-JUIT) organized a village visit to Chawsha village on the 22nd of April to discuss setting up of stalls of their hand made products during Le-Fiestus (JUIT annual fest) and to organize a health camp in the upcoming days.

5 students of our college (JUIT) went for the visit of Chawsa village. The Mahila Pradhan of the village provided us with the details about the items that will be displayed on the stalls during the fest which included homemade candles, soaps and items made up of cow dunk (sambhrani cups, incense sticks and diyas).

And after a warm discussion with the Pradhan, we took a walk around the village in search of a proper place where we can conduct the health camp and talked to the villagers about the benefits that they could get from the health camp that will be organized by Omega Leo Club Waknaghat with the collaboration of UBA-JUIT.

We conducted a random survey and asked people about their participation if we organize a health camp near Chawsha village and we received a positive response.



2. Promoting of "vocal for local": 27-29 April, 2023
