Exploring Rural Realities: Charting the Path for Implementation of Government Schemes in UBA Villages: A Meeting of Stakeholders in Development

A meeting of Stakeholders in Development was organized at Ammanpuram Gram Panchayat, Tiruchendur Block, Thoothukudi District at 2.30 pm on 22. 09.2023. The total

population of this village is 1885, and majority of the population belong to scheduled caste and scheduled tribe communities. Agriculture and allied activities is the main occupation of the population. The focus of this meeting was to chart the path for implementing Government Schemes especially the schemes of Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium



Enterprises, Government of India to promote rural entrepreneurs and enterprises in Ammanpuram Gram Panchayat. UBA Team Members from Holy Cross Home Science College, Thoothukudi, and student volunteers organized this programme. In her welcome address, Dr. N. N. Krishnaveni explained the purpose of meeting and welcomed rural youths and women to participate in the meeting actively. She encouraged the members of women



SHGs to explore the possibilities jointly for enterprises. promoting rural Prof. K. Ravichandran, Regional Coordinator, UBA, stated that the objective of this meeting was to connect the dots, i.e., to establish the linkage between the needs of rural youth and women and Government schemes for

promoting rural entrepreneurs and enterprises in Ammanpuram Gram Panchayat.

Miss G. Jerina Bubby, Director, Assistant Branch MSME -DFO, Tirunelveli, MSME, of (Ministry Government of India) briefly explained MSME Schemes and encouraged the women to become entrepreneurs. KVIC, Divisional Office, Madurai (Ministry of MSME, Government of India), explained KVIC Schemes. Mr. S.
