#### ACTIVITY 1:

Name of Activity: Regional Workshop for Participating Institutes at NIT Manipur on 24<sup>th</sup> September 2019.

Need of the Activity: To register the colleges under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan.

Description in 200 words (along with the Pictures):



The workshop was organised for the registration of the Participating Institutes under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan activities so to initiate work for rural development. The workshop was attended by 30 faculty members from Higher Educational Institutes. Dr. P. Albino Kumar (RC) welcomed all the participants, gave detailed presentation on UBA. He further delivered the activities accomplished as RCI in the adopted villages of Manipur and his experience in this field. The aim of the workshop was to familiarize the colleges about Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, its vision and the transformational changes brought in our rural areas under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan. It persuaded and amplified the colleges to participate under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan and carry out activities in any of their capacity as per their present status, competence and interest that results in the acceleration of sustainable growth in the rural areas. The session on adoption of villages, implementation of the activities, Plan of Action for UBA as PIs, funding Convergence were conducted during



the workshop. All the participants were interested to register under UBA, 10 participants registered and more are under process. All the participants requested and suggested for an orientation programme to organise for better understanding of the activities of UBA.

### ACTIVITY 2:

**Name of Activity:** Awareness programme on health and sanitation in the adopted village.

**Need of the Activity:** As requested by the villagers and the priority problem is limited knowledge on the importance of sanitation in the village.

**Description in 200 words (along with the Pictures):**



After the survey for the identification of issue in the villages, lack of importance on sanitation was found to be the main issue. As requested by the villagers and as required, “Awareness on health and sanitation” was organised on 14<sup>th</sup> September, 2019 in Nambol Makha, as joint programme attended by the adopted villagers. Villagers urged for the necessary of public toilet in the villages. On this occasion, important information about the health problems and their management were provided to the villagers. People were illuminated the harmful consequences from unhygienic sanitation on health. The programme has brought a great impact on the villagers. In addition to the programme, people were also educated the harmful of single use plastics and thus the “Swachhata hi Sewa campaign” was initiated in the villages. Cloth bags were distributed to the villagers as an initiative to use cloth bags instead of plastic bags. However, villagers have mentioned the problems arise in the adequate collection, place to discard and recycling system. So, in guidelines, they were advised to encourage Youth Club, organise social service program every weekend and construct a dustbin or compost pit to discard plastic bags which later will be disposed of by Municipality Members.

### ACTIVITY 3:

**Name of Activity:** “Swachhata hi Sewa Campaign” on 21<sup>st</sup> September at Kongkham Awang and Koriphaba

**Need of the Activity:** To make plastic free villages and instructed to organised by Higher Authority.

**Description in 200 words (along with the Pictures):**





In continuation of the “Swachhata hi Sewa” campaign started in the other adopted villages, it was further carried out in the others adopted villages i.e. Kongkham Awang and Koriphaba. It was started with the awareness campaign on the various issue due to the use of plastic. People were highlighted with the risks and hazards of single use plastics. The villagers were divided into 10 groups in order to cover the whole villages. Door to door collection of plastic were done. Collected plastics were stored separately as recyclable and non-recyclable. In Addition, the villagers also cleaned up their villagers by cutting the grasses, drained were cleaned. People of these villages were also educated on the use of paper or fabric (cotton or jute) instead of plastic bags which creates many health and environment hazards. Cloth bags were distributed. Awareness were also spread to the villagers about the proper disposal of plastic waste so that it can be recycled or disposed of properly.

#### ACTIVITY 4:

Name of Activity: “Swachhata hi Sewa Campaign” on 2nd October 2019 at the adopted villages and NIT Campus

Need of the Activity: To make plastic free villages and instructed to organised by Higher Authority.

Description in 200 words (along with the Pictures):



In continuation of the campaign conducted from 14<sup>th</sup> September in the adopted villages, on 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2019, UBA NIT Students Club members were taken to the adopted villages. The students took initiative role in the program, collected the plastics and stored the recyclable and non-recyclable plastics separately. The students also educated the villages about the plastics and its impact upon human health and environment. The campaign with the students has a great impact in the villagers and thus the villages were declared as plastic free villages. To make the campaign more effective and to spread the message ‘No more plastic bags”, the campaign is followed by the presentation about the problems arise due to the use of plastics. The presentation gave outstanding result in terms of learning and sharing knowledge. Later, Sharmdan was conducted in the Institute’s campus. The Director has stressed the single-use plastic has a highly detrimental impact on humans and also urged all to discard the use such single-use plastics as plastic bags. On this day, Director has declared the campus “Plastic free campus” and pledged to make the campus free of plastic waste, to collect all plastic waste and ensure its safe disposal

1	<p>Installation of Pumping units for existing low cost water treatment plant</p> <p>The existing low-cost water treatment plant at the adopted villages, Nambol Makha, was constructed by UBA NIT Manipur. It was operated by hiring a generator cum pump every alternate day which is not working presently. Therefore, a new water pump needs to be purchased and hand over to the villages for the effective running of the treatment plant and the installation of the pump is required immediately.</p>

3	<p>Orientation Programme for newly registered PIs under UBA</p> <p>As RC, for orienting the PIs for better understanding and implementation of UBA activities.</p>
