Title of the Activity: Baseline Household Survey

Need of the Activity:

As prophesied by Gandhi Ji in his seminal work 'Hind Swaraj,' the Western developmental paradigm, based on centralized technologies and urbanization, has spawned significant problems such as increasing inequity (leading to crime and violence) and climate change as a result of accelerated ecological degradation. To alleviate these issues, it is necessary to promote the development of rural areas in accordance with Gandhi's vision of self-sufficient "village republics," based on local resources and employing decentralized, eco-friendly technologies so that the basic needs of food, clothing, and shelter, sanitation, health care, energy, livelihood, transportation, and education can be met locally. This should be the goal of holistic village development. Currently, 70% of India's population resides in rural areas and participates in an agrarian economy, with the agriculture and allied sector employing 51% of the total labor force but contributing only 17% to the country's gross domestic product. Huge developmental disparities exist between the rural and urban sectors, including disparities in health, education, incomes, fundamental amenities, and employment opportunities, all of



which contribute to widespread discontent and migration to urban areas. The imperatives of sustainable development, which are increasingly felt around the globe, also require the eco-friendly development of the villages and the creation of suitable employment opportunities locally. Urbanization expansion is neither desirable nor sustainable. Aside from a few exceptions, our professional higher education institutions have hardly contributed directly to the development of the rural sector up until this point. In this regard, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) is a necessary and extremely challenging initiative.

Vision: Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is inspired by the vision of transformational change in rural development processes by leveraging knowledge institutions to assist in constructing the architecture of an Inclusive India.

Mission: The mission of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is to enable higher education institutions to collaborate with rural Indians to identify development challenges and develop appropriate solutions for accelerating sustainable growth. It also seeks to establish a virtuous cycle between society and an inclusive academic system by providing knowledge and practices for emerging professions and by enhancing the capacity of both the public and private sectors to address the development requirements of rural India.

Goals: Develop a comprehension of the development agenda within Higher Education institutions, as well as institutional capacity and training pertinent to national requirements, particularly those of rural India.

- Reiterate the importance of fieldwork, stakeholder interactions, and design for societal goals as the foundation of higher education.
- To emphasize rigor in reporting and value in outputs as essential to the development of new professions.
- Provide rural India and regional agencies with access to the professional resources of higher education institutions, particularly those that have achieved academic excellence in the fields of science, engineering, technology, and management.
- To enhance development outcomes as a result of this study. • To foster a new dialogue within the larger community on science, society, and the environment, and to develop a sense of collective dignity and destiny.

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is a Central Government Program that enables higher education institutions to collaborate with the rural population of India by identifying development challenges and developing appropriate solutions to accelerate sustainable growth. It seeks to establish a virtuous cycle between society and an inclusive academic system by providing knowledge and practices for emerging professions and by enhancing the capacity of both the public and private sectors to address the development requirements of rural India.

To accomplish this, the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) solicited applications from institutions offering higher education in India. The MHRD application format requested information about five localities identified for work and the college's Programme Coordinator. Our college selected five villages, namely Mudholi, Bhamdeli, Sitaram Peth, Kondegaon Mal, and Ghosari, in accordance with the MHRD's instructions. Mr. Dilip M. Bawane from the Department of English and Dr. S. K. Gudadhe from Dept. of Environment Science have been designated as the program's Coordinator and Co-Coordinator respectively. Approximately 1800 institutions have submitted applications expressing interest in the program's implementation. Our college was one of 1800 educational institutions. In March of 2023, the MHRD released a list of selected institutions, which included our college. Dr. Khatri Mahavidyalaya, Tukum, Chandrapur, has commenced work on a baseline survey of the identified villages, per MHRD directives. The UBA Co-ordinator, Mr. D. M. Bawane, and co-coordinator, Dr. S. K. Gudadhe, commenced the baseline activity for Community Organization on April 15, 2023.
