


Introduction

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan as a flagship programme of Ministry of Education, Govt of India envisaged the need of transformational change in rural India with cooperation of Higher Educational Institution as a architecture of an Inclusive India. St Pauls College of Pharmacy has been designated as participating Institute under UBA in the year 2020. As part of UBA mission the HEI St. Pauls College of Pharmacy has adopted five villages for their integral development. The list of five villages includes Manchal, Thippaiguda, Dadpally, Chittapur and Lingampally belonging to Ranga Reddy district. The activities initiated and monitored by HEI under the UBA programme include village survey, household survey, identifying the problems and preparing a village development plan for their respective villages, Developing way forward plan suitable to uplift socio economic development. The proposed developmental works are to be performed by the existing schemes of the Government in utilizing the UBA fund proposed for the SEG proposal

Scope

The SEG proposal was developed based on the survey results of UBA village survey programme which could emphasize the need of socioeconomic upliftment and strength of the villages with its traditional roots of knowledge as agriculture. The SEG proposal emphasized on "Cultivation of Black rice and millets" as rural upliftment programme which was approved by UBA under sustainable agriculture system.

Objectives

- 1. To conduct village survey and house hold survey
- 2. To analyze the needs of the local population of the villages
- 3. Design and development of research inquisitives applicable to the area in order to uplift the village with strong socio economic background
- 4. To work in orientation with the SEG proposal to uplift agriculture rural development
- 5. To analyze the project time to time for its timely completion

Activity 2: Activities to motivate Villagers community towards UBA participating institute (Sep-Dec 2022)

1. A meeting was organized at Manchal on 9th September, 2021 to motivate community members (villagers, Students, faculty members and staff members) to participate enthusiastically in the







activities of UBA at Manchal and also discuss to adopt a new Five villages in close proximate of institution for better coordinating with villager's. Name of villages are: 1. Manchal 2. Dadpally 3. Chittapur 4. Lingampally 5. Thippaiguda (**Report in Annexure 1**)

Activity 3: Govt Awareness camp in association with Village Panchayat secretaries

The camp was conducted in each village to conduct awareness on the available govt schemes for agriculture and also the village secretaries were involved to develop Village development plan. Around 1000 villagers were involved and the village development plan was approved and circulated to the sarpanch of the respective villages. (**Details in Annexure 2**)

Activity 3: SEED development program

The seeds were procured and prior to the initiation the field were prepared for sowing of seeds including ploughing of 2 hectares of land. Further on July 25th 2022 the seeds were sown and in between the fertilizer treatment etc were carried out.

November 2022: the harvesting was done and the paddy obtained was for milling.

All the details of the seed procurement, ploughing, sowing, harvesting and the allocated funds are reported in **Annexure 3**

Activity 4: Continuous monitoring of activities by PI

The PI is vigilant on the activities and the connections between the village panchayat secretaries in order to effectively execute the village development plan.

Periodical meetings in order to address the issues with rain and irrigation were communicated to local panchayat secretaries and also the issues were addressed.

The PI has taken key initiative to engage the project staff to conduct govt awareness program, meetings and also in the farming practices.

The timeline reports and the utilization certificate of the village survey has been communicated to IIT Rourkeela National Coordinating institute

- 3. School infrastructure is in bad condition.
- 4. Problem of wide consumption of alcoholism among villagers.







- 5. Management of liquid and solid wastes.
- 6. No street lights and transport at certain places like chittapur and dadpally.
- 7. 60% of Unemployment was observed.
- 8. No primary health center at dadpally and thippaigguda.



As part of IIC,AMC and UBA program students of B. Pharmacy IV year and II, III, IV year of Pharm D of St Pauls have visited Manchal village, students made door visit to identify the problem that villagers were facing. Students interacted with villagers of all age groups in friendly manager enquiring about the medication, food habits and water. In the process understood that villagers do nothave basic understanding of side effects of medication, importance of medical perceptions, hygiene and nutrition.

Students strongly echoed the importance of village development plans such as medical camps, awareness of ADR. Eradication of water contamination and healthy food habits.

- Nutritional awareness, especially for children and women


